

Analysis of Senate 24 Race

Overview

In the race for Missouri Senate District 24, Democrat **Tracy McCreery** defeated Republican **George Hruza** by 6,917 votes (8.6%).

<u>Turnout</u> was approximately 73.6% of 2020 Presidential levels, with no clear turnout edge for Republicans or Democrats. Areas with higher college attainment had somewhat better relative turnout, which is usually the case during midterm elections.


Important municipalities for McCreery's win were Kirkwood (which she won by 3,248 votes), Maryland Heights (won by 2,104) Creve Coeur (won by 1,671), and unincorporated Creve Coeur Township (won by 1,464). Hruza netted the most votes from unincorporated Meramec Township (which he won by 971), unincorporated Tesson Ferry township (won by 852), Sunset Hills (won by 717), and Des Peres (won by 602).

In the race for U.S. Senate, Trudy Busch Valentine carried Senate District 24 by 12,993 votes (16.0%), while in the 2020 Presidential election, President Biden had carried the district by approximately 13,770 votes (12.6%)






Turnout Compared to 2020 by Municipality
