## Missouri Statewide

Survey conducted March 28 through March 29, 2023. 1,102 likely 2024 November Election voters participated in the survey. Survey weighted to match expected turnout demographics for the 2024 November Election. Margin of Error is $+/-3 \%$ with a $95 \%$ level of confidence.
