## Missouri Statewide

Survey conducted August 2 through August 3, 2023. 834 likely 2024 November Election voters participated in the survey. Survey weighted to match expected turnout demographics for the 2024 November Election. Margin of Error is $+/-3.4 \%$ with a $95 \%$ level of confidence. Totals do not always equal $100 \%$ due to rounding. Survey conducted by Remington Research Group on behalf of Missouri Scout.
